## SEED COLLECTION GUIDE

with Tomorrow's Trees

## **Plan**

- 1. When? September and October
- 2. Where? Your yard, neighborhood, street trees, churches, schools, parking lots and parks. Think trees in open spaces but not forests! Look for minimal ground cover.
- 3. Permission? If you wish to collect from a property other than your own—even if it is public land—be sure to get permission!
- 4. Which Trees? Maryland and VA state nurseries collect different types of acorns and tree seeds year to year. Check the list! And collect from healthy looking trees.
- 5. Still not sure? Attend an event and learn from the pros!

## Gather

- 1. Make sure the tree is correctly identified. (If unsure include a leaf in the bag)
- 2. Don't MIX types of acorns! One type per bag.
- 3. Collect in a dry bag made of breathable material, such as burlap or paper. No plastic! (Extra bags will be at collection bins)
- 4. "If it has a sprout, hole or crack, then throw it back!" (The nursery cannot plant sprouted seeds)
- 5. Minimize debris (e.g. sticks, leaves, gravel, trash) in the collection bag.
- 6. Please don't float test- this will be done at the nursery and no need to clean fruit seeds (unless you want to eat paw-paw fruit).
- 7. Leave 30% behind for the wildlife.

## **Drop-Off**

- 1. Find your nearest drop-off site @ tomorrows-trees.org/find-a-dropoff/
- 2. Label the bag (Tree type, location, date collected).
- 3. Drop your collection in the drop-off bin. \*Bin hosts and volunteers will take collections to refrigerated storage once a week
